The **Constitution of India** is the **longest written constitution** in the world, consisting of **448 articles** divided into **25 parts** and **12 schedules**. It established India as a sovereign, socialist, secular, and democratic republic.


**5. Digital Outreach:**

- The Government of India has made efforts to digitally disseminate information about the Constitution, including making the full text of the Constitution available online.


**The Role of the Constitution in Contemporary India**


